2015 MLB All-Star Game in Cincinnati USA Facts & Figures

Economic impact*

Geography and economic impact of past All-Star Games are important in deriving an estimate for Cincinnati as a host of the 2015 event. Cincinnati is closer in size to Minneapolis, St. Louis and Kansas City rather than the coastal cities; an economic impact similar in size could be expected (see Table 1). Given the event occurs in the future, there will be some inflationary effect. Based on these factors, the estimated economic impact* of the 2015 MLB All-Star Game to the Cincinnati economy would be approximately \$60 million¹. Already, MLB has booked 16,165 hotel room nights for next year from July 11-15 for its contingent of executives, corporate sponsors and guests¹.

Potential TV viewership*

A 2015 All-Star Game hosted in Cincinnati could be expected to be viewed on television by approximately 35 million people¹. Again the Midwestern geographic similarity of Cincinnati to Minneapolis, Kansas City and St. Louis factors into the estimate, as well the recent occurrence of these events.
